Dear Parents/Caregivers

What a wonderful day we had last week with our open classes and school barbecue. Thankyou to all parents who took the time out of their day to come and see what wonderful work your children are doing at school.

Chuck Duck: The school has formed a partnership with local company Chuck Duck. Charles Webster is the founder of the company and he works with a number of schools in the Newcastle area improving the grounds and supporting the breakfast programs. Some of the ideas we have are to plant a significant native "bush tucker" garden, flower garden and regular vege patch including watermelons, rockmelons and passionfruit. Also we have plans to keep native bees which are stingless but still produce wonderful honey for the kids to eat and take home!

Mathletics: We have just renewed our Mathletics licence and some good news! Students at Islington School have so far answered 10500 curriculum based questions correctly. However, more impressive is that we have answered 166000 live mathletics questions correctly! Well done guys, keep it going!

Congratulations Phoenix: Phoenix Tuavao has been selected as part of the Hunter School Singers. Phoenix is one of only about 20 students selected from the entire region and he will be participating in a number of concerts over the coming weeks including performing at the Opera House in Sydney. Great work Phoenix, we are very proud of you!

Lunchtime Clubs: The school has started a number of lunchtime clubs to keep your kids active and busy at lunchtimes. Students can participate in these clubs voluntarily.
