Active Travel

Help test Active Travel School Bus app!

You've all heard of walking school buses. We have developed a mobile phone app to support an Active Travel School Bus program, to make it work reliably and safely.

Islington Public School families can help us to test it out. If the approach works here, it can be used by other schools in Newcastle and then Australia.

How it works:

- Families register their student to a designated walk day/time/route
- Student gets 'checked in' when they're picked up by the 'driver'
- At the school gate, teacher checks student off the 'bus'
- Parent gets an SMS/email to say child has arrived

Driver is a qualified fitness instructor, with first aid/CPR, exercise qualifications and a current working with children check, paid by local gym.

It's free for parents & school. The project is a trial run by Newcastle Cycleways Movement the Heart Foundation and the Primary Health Network


