- Statistics and probability Data and Chance

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### **Attendance – Everyday Matters**

We want to do all we can to be sure your child/children achieve their potential and enjoy being in school. We know that school is the best pace to learn. By attending school every day your child will get the most out of their learning.

When your child is absent it is important you let the school know, including the reason why, on the day or the day before. This helps make sure we know where our students are and offer support for you and your family if needed.

If you are having trouble getting your child to school every day or on time, please talk to your child's class teacher so we can work together, because every day counts.

Missing a day here or there may not be seen like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day a week that's 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in one year. Over an entire journey this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning.
